WHO SHOULD COME?

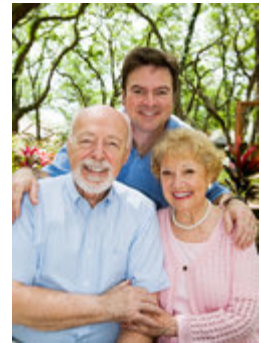
Baby boomers with aging parents
